The surprising persistence of authoritarian regimes since the end of the Cold War has inspired a major new literature in comparative politics on how non-democracy works. This course explores the politics of authoritarian rule by raising a number of questions, including: How should authoritarian regimes, including so-called "hybrid regimes," best be classified? What explains the resilience of authoritarian rule? Why do so many authoritarian regimes hold elections and convene parliaments? How do citizens make claims against authoritarian regimes? How do regimes respond to popular mobilization? The course draws on case studies from around the world, including the Middle East, Russia, and China.
